The Promise and Benefit of Baptism, Genesis 17:7-8

Membership requires certain duties and grants certain privileges.

Can you have membership privileges and have someone else meet the requirements? We just have to show up.

My Promise from God in Baptism

The Promise - I will be their God.

God speaks to us in baptism, and we respond in faith.

I will enter into a relationship of grace with you.
I will bind Myself to My own word, to do what I have promised.

The Promiser - I will be your God.

Who is this God that is promising to be our God?

The One who was offended by our sin promises to be our God.

The Promisee - I will be their God.

To whom does God give the promise to be their God? To the descendants of Abraham

The Reason for Baptism, is it Different for Children and Adults?

The promise belongs to them both as members of the covenant.

My Benefit from God in Baptism

Sign and Seal of the Promise

God has given us a sign and seal of the covenant.

Sign that the Spirit of God cleanses us from \sin by the blood of Christ

It is a sign of regeneration, and engrafting into Christ. Union with Him

What is Baptism a Seal of?

Dormant regeneration? Presumptive regeneration?

Baptism is a seal of the promise of the gospel.

The sacraments are a gospel ministry to the people of God.

It is like having a check written out in your name.

Baptism is for all of life, For all Times

The visible gospel is proclaimed to all again by the water.

Baptism calls us to Separation from the World

God has set us apart to Himself as His people.

The water in baptism is not magic; it does not work automatically.

Our duty is faith. To take God at His word, to walk in His promises.
