Believing in God's Promises Creates a Reality Gap

Although God prepared Abram and Sarai to hear his call, and then called them to become a great nation through which blessing would come to all the nations. For a long time all that distinguished them from their neighbors was the promise of God. There was no halo of glory surrounding their camels as they traveled from Haran to Canaan; nor was there a pillar of cloud and fire to lead them, as Israel had coming out of Egypt. At a time when many other people were traversing the Near East, they appear to be just another group of travelers. Only the promise of God marked them out as different.

It's the same way today, isn't it? What marks you out from your non-Christian neighbors? You're not smarter than they are; you're not richer; you're not better looking or healthier. You experience many of the some kinds of problems and crises that they do. If you're a Christian, you know that God is working in you and through you to achieve his purposes in the world. If you're a Christian, you know that "for those who love God all things work together for good" (Romans 8:28).

It is precisely the existence of such promises that makes the experience of the reality gap so intense. For the non-Christian, there is logically no reality gap. His or her life may be going well or it may not, but either way it has no meaning. If one is simply a chance collocation of atoms, there is no reason why one's life should go well or why one's sufferings should have any significance. There is no promise that the non-Christian can claim. He or she is left simply hoping against hope that everything will turn out all right in the end, whatever "right" is. The Christian, however, is different. He or she knows that God is in control of all things and that, even if all appearances are to the contrary, God has a plan in which all things heaven and under heaven will work out for his glory and our good. It is precisely our faith that creates the reality gap when we don't understand how particular trials or circumstances will work out.
